Javier Morgado is a veteran, four-time Emmy awardwinning executive producer with more than 20 years' experience in network, cable, and local TV news. Most recently, he was the showrunner of CNN's "At This Hour," and previously led CNN's award-winning morning show, "New Day," where he oversaw 15 hours of live programming every week. At CNN, Morgado won two national News Emmy awards. He is also a recipient of the Edward R. Murrow Award for

continuing coverage of Hurricane Maria in Puerto Rico.

Prior to joining CNN, Morgado also had an illustrious run at NBC News, where he was supervising producer of NBC's "TODAY" show from 2006-2010, and won two national Daytime Emmy awards for outstanding morning program. Previously, he was senior editor at the NBC News Network Desk, managing domestic and international news coverage for the network's news division and MSNBC. He began his journalism career in local news at WTVJ and WPLG in his hometown of Miami, Florida.

Morgado was recently inducted into the prestigious Silver Circle honor society of the National Academy of Television Arts & Sciences (NATAS), which recognizes significant contributions and distinguished service to the television news industry. The New York City Council also honored him with a proclamation for his "outstanding contributions to journalism, the arts, and the LGBTQ+ community."

Morgado serves as chairman of the board of trustees for the prestigious Martha Graham Dance Company. He is also on the board of directors for The Ali Forney Center, the Stonewall Community Foundation, the University of Miami Alumni Association, the Leadership Council of Broadway Cares/Equity Fights AIDS, and serves on the Dean's Advisory Council at Fordham Gabelli School of Business and the Dean's Advisory Committee at the University of Miami School of Communication.
