



## SUSAN MULLANE, B.ED. '75, M.ED. '77, PH.D. '95

Professor, Department of Kinesiology and Sport Sciences School of Education and Human Development, University of Miami

Susan Mullane is a three-time University of Miami alumna, a former student-athlete, and one of the first women in the country to receive an athletic scholarship. Mullane served the University of Miami as associate dean of students for 10 years and has extensive experience in leadership development and student development. As a faculty member in the School of Education and Human Development's Department of Kinesiology and Sport

Sciences, Mullane directs the undergraduate sport administration program that leads to a Bachelor of Science degree in education and teaches both undergraduate and graduate courses in sport administration. In addition to leadership and ethics, she has taught courses in conflict management, motivation, and research methods.

Mullane's areas of expertise and research include leadership, ethics, sport ethics, and higher education. She has published and presented extensively in these areas, in such journals as the Sport Marketing Quarterly, Journal of Sport Management, the International Journal of Sport Communication, Applied Research in Coaching and Athletics Annual, and the NASPA (Student Affairs Administration) Journal, and has presented at more than 50 local, national, and international conferences and professional meetings.

A founding member of the University of Miami's Ethics Consortium, Mullane has served as codirector of the Program for Ethics and Social Responsibility in the School of Education and Human Development. She served as chairperson of the Ethics Advisory Committee for the School Board of Miami-Dade County Public Schools, in addition to co-authoring the Code of Ethics adopted by the Miami-Dade County School Board. Most recently, she developed and now directs the Sport Ethics Debate programs in the School of Education and Human Development. The Sport Administration graduate student Sport Ethics Debate is entering its 13th year.

Mullane holds her bachelor's and master's degrees from the University of Miami, as well as her doctorate in higher education/sport administration. She has served on the University's Alumni Association as a director and as its faculty representative. Mullane has two sons and two daughters-in-law who are also University of Miami alumni.
