Arbitration and Mediation Center in Geneva, Switzerland. Before joining WIPO, Enix-Ross was the director of international litigation for the Dispute Analysis and Corporate Recovery Services Group of Price Waterhouse, and, before that, served for seven years as the American representative to the International Chamber of Commerce International Court of Arbitration.

Enix-Ross is a past chair of the American Bar Association House of Delegates and the ABA Center for Human Rights and chair of the Center's Business and Human Rights Project. She is a former chair of the ABA Section of International Law, where she was the Goal IX officer and co-founded the Women's Interest Network.
